Leonard J. Chabert Medical Center Wins Multiple Awards at LSU Forum

Baton Rouge (February 19, 2008) – The LSU Health Care Services Division (HCSD) awarded Leonard J. Chabert Medical Center (LJCMC) multiple awards for quality health care at the eleventh annual LSU HCSD Health Care Effectiveness Forum, entitled “Eliminating Disparities and Improving Access to Relationship-Centered Care,” in Baton Rouge. The seven hospitals of LSU HCSD were eligible for the awards.

LJCMC won first place for clinical excellence in cancer screening.

LJCMC won first place for clinical excellence for congestive heart failure care.

LJCMC won first place for most improved in its care of congestive heart failure patients.

LJCMC won second place for clinical excellence in diabetic care.

LJCMC won second place for clinical excellence in HIV/AIDS care.

The LSU Health System is one of the largest public health care delivery systems in the country. It has over 60,000 admissions, 350,000 patient days, 1 million outpatient visits, and over 350,000 emergency department visits.
