Letter from the Vice President

As healthcare and healthcare education evolve at an equally quick pace, the LSU Health System is taking advantage of its strengths and developing its resources. With two health sciences centers, ten hospitals, and hundreds of outpatient clinics statewide, LSU has a highly sophisticated, statewide architecture for the delivery of quality healthcare and healthcare education. LSU is where excellence begins and Louisiana benefits.

LSU's coordinated system of care, which includes doctors, clinics, hospitals, and pharmacies, along with payment mechanisms that facilitate population-based systems of care, allows us to continually improve our outcomes while minimizing costs. Because we are a true system of care, we can address issues such as service overutilization, which has been so heavily emphasized in state and federal reform discussions. Our cost containment efforts can achieve benefit not only at the individual patient level but, importantly, at the population level. Simply stated, a coordinated system of care is necessary to optimally manage outcomes and costs for a large population.

Our system is available to anyone desiring high quality healthcare, regardless of the ability to pay. With an eye always on efficiency and our patients' best interests, we provide the vast majority of care in clinics, delivering primary and preventive medical services as well as disease management programs for those with chronic diseases. In addition, in many areas, our specialty care clinics are the only options available for uninsured individuals and Medicaid recipients.

It makes sense that LSU is known for quality healthcare, with its Schools of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Graduate Studies, Public Health, and Allied Health Professions. No other institution equals LSU for the number of healthcare professionals it trains for Louisiana. Regardless of where someone receives healthcare in the state, chances are good that the healthcare providers were trained by LSU or in LSU institutions.

We weigh our dual responsibility daily and continually seek ways to improve our services. The fluid field of healthcare calls for constant innovation and adjustment; in that context, we also demand from ourselves that we maintain both our quality and integrity. With due diligence and in-depth deliberation, we have charted a course on two fronts for the simultaneous advancement of our efforts in healthcare and healthcare education to meet the needs of our citizens.

Federal Health Care Reform will bring many benefits and challenges to our population. While there are a number of uncertainties surrounding the impact of Health Care Reform on the state and LSU, we can be fairly confident that insuring a large number of our uninsured citizens will result in an increased demand for services. In a state that is almost entirely a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), this coverage expansion will create new pressures and opportunities for LSU—both as the largest provider of services for the uninsured and as the largest producer of physician workforce. For those unsure of LSU's role in this new world, I say that we will have more, not less work to do. As we have always done, LSU stands ready to meet these challenges to take advantage of the opportunities presented in the federal reform to better serve Louisiana's population.

A ninety-eight bed acute care hospital, Bogalusa Medical Center (BMC) has a medical staff of primary and specialty physicians and multiple facilities to meet the healthcare needs of its patients.

The BMC surgery team is available twenty-four hours, seven days a week, providing services to several thousand patients annually.

Special Beginnings Family Center, BMC's new state-of-the-art labor and delivery unit, has an estimated 200 births annually, filling a ten-year void in labor and delivery services for this area of the North Shore. It allows medical residents to receive invaluable, high-quality OB/GYN training and fulfills accreditation requirements for the BMC Rural Family Medicine Residency Program.

BMC has also expanded services in psychiatry, ophthalmology, imaging, cardiology, pediatrics, and pathology. It is a cytology processing center for other LSU hospitals.


BMC participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, which manages chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.

The BMC Memphis Street Outpatient Clinic has recognition status as a Physician Practice Connections—Patient Centered Medical Home by the NCQA. Having met rigorous NCQA requirements to receive this recognition, the clinic provides ongoing preventive and early intervention healthcare to patients and coordinates specialized care with BMC when patients require it.


BMC has seen a significant increase in the number of patients in the years after Hurricane Katrina. BMC has a dedicated staff as evidenced by a nursing turnover rate far below the national average, helping to maintain a tightly knit circle of caregivers who fulfill the BMC mission of treating their patients like family.


Inpatient Admissions by ZIP Code

In fact, EKLMC far exceeded the top 15 percent; its percentile ranking was 3.32, placing it among the top four percent in the nation, an objective testament to the quality healthcare EKLMC provides.

EKLMC serves East Baton Rouge Parish and the seven surrounding parishes of Ascension, West Baton Rouge, East and West Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston and Pointe Coupee.

EKLMC provides quality care regardless of a patient's ability to pay and serves as a teaching hospital for graduate medical education, nursing, and allied healthcare professions. It also offers the community health education and preventive services.

Under EKLMC governance, the LSU Health System Surgical Facility performs ambulatory surgeries and procedures for adult and pediatric otorhinolaryngology, gynecology, orthopedics, endoscopy, diagnostic radiology, and general surgery.

EKLMC participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, which manages chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.

EKLMC has outpatient services for women's health, family practice, internal medicine, surgery, orthopedics, oral surgery, HIV, pediatrics, dermatology, rheumatology, and other subspecialties and inpatient services for obstetrics, internal and emergency medicine, and surgery.



EKLMC is in partnership with the East Baton Rouge Parish School Board, providing healthcare in six school-based clinics for schools throughout the region.






Inpatient Admissions by ZIP Code

The Interim LSU Public Hospital (ILH) is the critical component in the provision of graduate medical education and quality healthcare in South Louisiana. A tertiary healthcare center, the ILH and its specialty and primary care clinics support the LSU and Tulane medical schools and their residency programs. Thousands of students from these two schools, the LSU schools of dentistry, nursing, and allied health, the Xavier University College of Pharmacy, and other nursing schools depend on ILH as their training site.

ILH community clinics bring quality healthcare to neighborhoods where many would forego healthcare because of no transportation or an inability to pay. These community clinics, all accredited by the NCQA as "Medical Homes," offer comprehensive primary healthcare and coordinated access to specialty care.

The HIV Outpatient Program (HOP), a nationally recognized center for HIV healthcare, training, and research, and other specialty clinics complement the comprehensive and coordinated ILH network, which provides quality healthcare to anyone who needs it, the insured, underinsured, and uninsured.

ILH participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, which manages chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.


The LSU Level 1 Trauma Center, the only one in South Louisiana, provides care to all major trauma victims in New Orleans and its surrounding ten-parish area. The presence of a Level 1 trauma Center indicates that LSU is a premier provider of comprehensive healthcare services.

The trauma center provides optimal care for injured patients with full trauma-center staff, facilities, and services available twenty-four hours a day. The Greater New Orleans area relies exclusively on ILH for this highly specialized, comprehensive care.





A fundamental component of quality healthcare on the North Shore, Lallie Kemp Regional Medical Center (LKRMC) is available primarily for citizens of the Florida parishes. With a maximum capacity of 25 acute care/ swing beds, LKRMC is a critical access hospital for the region. LKRMC meets federal requirements for this designation: it is in a rural area, it provides 24 hour emergency care services, and it maintains an average length of stay of 96 hours or less for each patient. Available to anyone regardless of the ability to pay, LKRMC is a major provider of healthcare in the area.

Fully accredited by the Joint Commission, LKRMC is also a clinical training site for physicians, allied health professionals and students of technical and nursing schools, providing much needed healthcare professionals to the North Shore.

LKRMC received the Silver Level 2009 Louisiana Hospital Quality Award from the Louisiana Health Care Review, one of the highest levels this Medicare quality improvement organization recognizes. LKRMC received the award for improving the healthcare it provides to its patients.


LKRMC participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, which manages chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.




Inpatient Admissions by ZIP Code

LJCMC participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, which manages chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.





From pediatrics to geriatrics, University Medical Center (UMC) is a major site of quality healthcare and graduate medical education. An acute care hospital for all in Acadiana, UMC is the major site for the LSU Rural Scholars Track. The Rural Scholars Track (RST) program is offered through the LSU School of Medicine – New Orleans. This program was created to address the physician shortage and to encourage students to practice primary-care medicine in rural areas of Louisiana.

UMC Diagnostic Cardiology continues to further the frontier of cardiovascular imaging. UMC is the only LSU hospital performing Cardiac Magnetic Resonance Imaging with a 3 Tesla magnet.

Acquiring a vascular surgeon and certified ultrasound nurse is enabling the establishment of a nationally recognized and certified Vascular Lab. Other services added this year include a full-time gastroenterologist, pulmonary and breast fine-needle aspirate diagnostic clinics, vascular and laser surgeries, sleep studies, pediatric psychology, and urology.

UMC's outpatient pharmacy continues to grow supporting the disease management clinic, indigent patients, HIV services, and hospital clinics.

The UMC Ophthalmology Program's new outpatient clinic increases access for patients while it strengthens the ophthalmology residency program providing essential medical services to 600 patients a month. UMC is the only hospital in Acadiana performing corneal transplants.

UMC also offers a variety of primary care and surgical services.

The Pediatric Clinic has NCQA recognition status as a "Medical Home" providing the best available primary care and coordinating access to specialty care.


UMC's redesigned emergency services include the Mental Health Emergency Room Extension, improving the care of patients with acute behavioral health emergencies.

UMC participates in the LSU Disease Management Program, managing chronic diseases according to nationally accepted, evidence-based guidelines.




LSU's University Hospital in Shreveport is a major medical center and the site of many innovations in medical care. This 459 bed facility is part of the LSU Health Sciences Center - Shreveport. It provides primary care to residents across the Shreveport- Bossier City metropolitan area and specialty care to persons across Louisiana, East Texas and South Arkansas. 





The E. A. Conway Medical Center is a 158-bed teaching hospital in Monroe, Louisiana. It is an integral part of the LSU Health Sciences Center at Shreveport (LSUHSC-Shreveport). 


Huey P. Long Medical Center is a 60-bed acute care hospital in Pineville. Founded in 1939, the medical center's primary service area is a nine-parish region of Central Louisiana. In addition to the inpatient facility in Pineville, the hospital operates extensive outpatient clinics at its England Airpark site in Alexandria. 


Inpatient Admissions by ZIP Code




